

Study Course Introduction

Old Landmarkism: What is it?

Course Design:

This course is designed to help those who study and engage in it to learn as much as they would like to learn about the doctrine which has come to be known as Landmarkism. There will be four parts of this course for each lesson. No one is required to complete all four parts in order to be included. Students are welcomed to take as much of the material as they would like. Following is a list of the four parts of each lesson and an explanation of each.

Four Parts of Each Lesson

- 1) Audio file of lecture
- 2) Book available for more study
- 3) Questions to help review lesson and assist in understanding
- 4) Written assignments for more in-depth learning

1) Audio file of lecture

Everyone is welcome to simply listen to the audio files of the lecture. Hopefully, the lectures will prove to be enriching to all who take time to listen to them. Nothing additional is required.

2) Book available for more study

Anyone who is interested could also purchase the book which will be used as a guideline for the study. There will be more material contained in the book than will be shared during the lecture. Any who would like to consider more details related to the topic of the lesson is encouraged to purchase the book. Details will be provided at the bottom of this page for the book and where it might be purchased.

3) Questions to help review lesson and assist in understanding

There are a number of questions for each lesson. The purpose of the questions is to help students review what they have learned. Students will be allowed to either grade their own work or share it back. If shared, I will review it for accuracy and return it with comments.

4) Optional written assignments for more in-depth learning

An additional written assignment will be available for each lesson for any who would like to take part in them. The additional written assignment will be in the form of a short paper, 2 to 3 pages. A question will be presented allowing for more in-depth study and an opportunity to arrange thoughts in a written paper. Many find this exercise truly helps them think through material in a way they had only gleaned over previously. This assignment is optional and only offered in the case anyone would like to dig deeper into the chapter being studied. If completed, these assignments will be reviewed and returned with comments.

Book to be used as a guide

Of course, the main book to be used in this study will be the Bible. It and only it is the sole rule of faith and practice. Any material which fails to meet the teaching of the Bible is unreliable. This said, the course will follow a book to be used as a simple guide. There will be times when parts of the book may be skipped or identified as faulty. This is to be expected when any book is used during this sort of a study. During a study, criticism of the text is inline. Nothing but the Bible is worth taking "as it is written".
